

# SURREY OAKS TASTING NOTES

## PERMANENT REAL ALES

<b>Harveys</b> Sussex Best 4.0%	A superb copper coloured session bitter, very balanced with a prominent hop character and fruity aroma. The taste includes malt and a strong hop finish.
<b>Surrey Hills</b> Ranmore Ale 3.8%	A straw coloured session beer that has a surprisingly full flavour for its strength. A pleasant and distinctive aroma is followed by moderate hop bitterness.
<b>Surrey Hills</b> Shere Drop 4.2%	Pale in colour with a subtle hint of grapefruit and lemon in the aroma. The wonderful hop bitterness is complemented by a balanced malt flavour. The beer has a long finish, which is moderately dry.



## GUEST REAL ALES

<b>Bank Top</b> Pavilion Pale Ale 4.5%	Created shortly after the brewery moved site to a tennis club pavilion this ale is extremely pale. The flavour is well rounded using primarily First Gold hops and Cascade to finish.
<b>Bath</b> SPA 3.7%	A fresh golden beer with light malt and hop character leading to a long bitter finish.
<b>Clark's</b> Westgate Gold 4.2%	A light coloured, fruity beer with the full body and rich aroma.
<b>Daleside</b> Summer Delight 3.4%	A pale, golden session beer displaying soft malt flavours with delicate floral, fruity hop notes
<b>Dark Star</b> Sunburst 4.8%	A hint of initial sweetness adds to the fruitiness of this summer ale without detracting from its clean flavour and rich hop aroma.
<b>Ossett</b> Silver King 4.3%	A lager style beer with a crisp, dry citrus fruity flavour.
<b>Palmers</b> Tally Ho 5.5%	A dark, nutty full-strength beer, first brewed in 1949, it has an oaky roasted flavour.
<b>Phoenix</b> Mid-Summer Madness 4.5%	Well-balanced, straw coloured beer. Full malt flavour balanced and a refreshing finish.
<b>Pilgrim</b> Moild 3.8%	Full-bodied dark, soft mild. Very well regarded and becoming extremely popular.
